

Attendance and Punctuality

We take attendance and punctuality very seriously at Heron Hill Primary School. Our attendance target this year is 97%, but all pupils should strive to achieve 100% attendance if they can. Our current attendance percentage is 95.8% so we can improve.

It is important that your child arrives at school every day and on time. This ensures children can have a calm and settled start to their morning. They are able to listen to the timetable for the day and begin learning straight away. Please make sure your child arrives on the yard at 8.45 am ready for school starting at 8.50 am.

Any child whose attendance falls below 90% is considered a persistent absentee. **12% of children have been persistently absent since the start of the new school year**. Schools are required to contact families if their child's attendance is at risk of dropping below 90% so that together we can take action to prevent this from happening.
