Busy Choir!





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Pastoral Learning Mentor: Mrs Little

Since starting my new role as Pastoral Learning Mentor in September, I have had the opportunity to work with children across the school, supporting their social and emotional needs and ensuring they are happy and thriving at school. To supplement this role, I have recently been trained by



Educational Psychologists to become an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant. This will allow me to further support children with a range of topics including managing emotions, building resilience and self-esteem, social and friendship skills and loss and bereavement. I will continue to work closely with Mrs Jones (SENCO) and class teachers to identify children that need a little extra help and sessions are offered on a 1:1 or small group basis dependent on the needs of the children. *Please do talk to me if you have any concerns about your child*. I can be contacted through the school office or please feel free to speak to me in the yard in a morning.

Hive - Late Booking Charge

We have always requested that parents do all they can to avoid same day after-school care bookings. On a very few occasions parents/carers have not collected their child at 3.15 pm, assuming we can facilitate; understandably, this can cause their child distress. Late booking requests are very disruptive, so from January 2023 they will incur an additional charge to cover admin and staffing costs.
