

We will:

- provide a broad, balanced and challenging curriculum to meet the individual needs of your child
- provide you with information on your child's progress, behaviour, attendance and punctuality through parents' meetings, annual progress reports and by alerting parents/carers whenever concerns arise
- encourage your child to take responsibility for the standard of their work and behaviour
- nurture a love of learning in your child, encouraging them to achieve their maximum potential
- build your child's self-confidence and independence
- ensure bullying, racist and other discriminating behaviours are not tolerated and that your child is taught respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and learns about British values of democracy and the rule of law
- inform parents about the teaching programme in each year group
- inform parents about important school events
- be welcoming and offer opportunities for parents to become involved in the daily life of school
- set appropriate homework regularly in accordance with the school's homework policy
- care for your child's safety, well-being and happiness, promoting their full development as valued members of the school and wider community

Parents and Carers

We will:

- work in partnership with the school, supporting Heron Hill's aims and ethos
- make sure my child arrives at school on time, rested and ready to learn
- make sure my child attends regularly and contact school promptly if my child is unable to attend due to illness
- support the school's policy on behaviour and anti-bullying, including cyberbullying
- ensure my child is a responsible online citizen and support the school's e-safety policy
- adhere to the school's digital images and recordings policy
- ensure my child wears the correct school uniform and PE kit
- support my child to complete homework tasks and other home learning as explained in the school's homework policy, providing them with a quiet place to focus on their homework
- read regularly with my child and help my child to learn key number facts by heart
- ensure my child goes to bed at a reasonable time on weekdays
- let school know if there are any issues that may affect my child's welfare or progress at school
- attend parent's meetings and discussions about my child's welfare and progress
- help my child to be independent and well-organised
